
Notable Events of March 2014

- **Assault Using a Vehicle As a Weapon:** March 29th, during a domestic dispute the female party used the male party's vehicle as a weapon to assault him, intentionally running over him with a full-sized pickup. Deputies have not yet located the female or the pickup. The victim is recovering.
- **Counterfeit Money:** Law enforcement agencies in east and south Snohomish county are encountering counterfeit \$10, \$20 and \$100 bills. Victims are receiving these bills when they accept change from retailers and when they accept currency from purchasers. Counterfeit detection pens are one cost-effective way to avoid being victimized by someone passing counterfeit currency. Much of the currency has been poorly replicated: no security tape embedded, no red/blue fibers within the paper, smudged or blurry ink/details, ink sometimes runs when wet. Compare any currency you receive with similar bills you know to be official US currency. The difference is often obvious.
- **Municipal Codes:** The Sheriff's office is assisting code enforcement, fire marshals, health department, US FDA and state agencies with investigation and enforcement in Gold Bar. Examples of violations include parking violations, junk vehicles, unlawful hazardous waste storage, garbage accumulation, animal control, noise control, and land use/permit violations. For many of these violations, a \$100 penalty may be assessed per violation per day that the violation persists. Our goal is to work reasonably with property owners and renters to gain compliance. Fines are levied when other methods are ineffective or are not appropriate for the circumstance.
- **Staffing:** The Darrington/Oso Mudslide has been described in international media as the most significant natural disaster on record in Snohomish County WA. The demand on public resources has had a dramatic impact on Sheriff's Office staffing levels. Just yesterday, another call for yet more law enforcement personnel went out. Deputy Saint-Denis has been temporarily reassigned to the relief efforts for an indefinite period. Coupled with a current vacancy on night shift, this results in occasions where deputies working the region are less familiar with local ordinances and issues. We continue to do our best to maintain consistency in staffing for the region. With this in mind, we hope to have our selection for a deputy to fill the vacancy on nights completed tomorrow evening. This deputy's reassignment to the Gold Bar region is expected to take effect relatively quickly, possibly as early as next week.

The following charts and tables compare calls for service in the reporting months to the same months in the previous year and provide a monthly average (Typical Month) in each category. Data displayed is for all dispatch groups provided service by the Gold Bar Region (KK) and Index (RR) police agencies. All statistics may be viewed at Gold Bar City Hall.


Property Crime - Gold Bar Region

Reports and Arrests Made





All Dispositions




Traffic Calls - Gold Bar Region
