

Notable Events of March 2015

• 911 is for <u>all</u> Police, Fire or Ambulance calls: Occasionally, when a citizen observes a matter that should be addressed by police, he or she may struggle with choosing to call 911. In Snohomish County, 911 is the only telephone number to call to summon law enforcement or to report to law enforcement, regardless of whether the nature of the report is urgent. A barking dog or a suspicious person should be reported to 911 just as a burglary would be reported to 911. If reporting a crime where property is damaged or stolen AND there is no known suspect AND the total value does not exceed \$5000 AND it is not something in progress or something that occurred within the last few minutes: the crime may be reported via internet at <u>mycrimereport.org</u>


• Incident Summary: The following are incidents documented with a case report. Incidents for which no report was completed are not included. 2 abandoned vehicles impounded, 3 assaults reported, 1 burglary of a storage building, 3 collisions including a hit and run, 1 controlled substance, 2 disturbances of the peace, 1 follow-up on a 2014 theft, 1 fraud, 1 harassment, 4 thefts, 1 trespass notice served, 3 vandalisms, 1 recovery of stolen vehicle, 2 warrant arrests.




• Incident Summary: 1 found or suspicious property and 1 theft. 1 trespass complaint was addressed just west of town.


Note: The numbers above do not always match the numbers shown in the charts on the following pages, in part because the statistics below are pulled from dispatch records which do not always accurately reflect the final type for the service call. A deputy may respond to a suspicious circumstance and later change the type to theft, for example.

The following charts and tables compare calls for service in the reporting months to the same months in the previous year and provide a monthly average (Typical Month) in each category. Data displayed is for all dispatch groups provided service by the Gold Bar Region (KK) and Index (RR) police agencies. All statistics may be viewed at Gold Bar City Hall.

Self Initiated: Calls initiated by deputy

Per Deputy: Total divided by number of assigned personnel (4 deputies)
