Notable Events of July 2016 Gold Bar

- Vehicle Recovery: The Sultan Food Bank's truck was recovered from a logging road off of Kellogg Lake
 Road. After it was stolen, it had been spray-painted black and was seen by area residents as it was being driven
 around the region. A local timber management supervisor discovered the vehicle on his company's land and
 called 911. Two other stolen vehicles were recovered, one in Gold Bar off of Ley Rd and one in May Creek
 Estates off of Ajer Drive where we arrested a suspect.
- Nuisance property vacated: The residents at 106 4th Street, Gold Bar, were evicted by the property owner who continues to work on a large and difficult clean-up. Denise Beaston's efforts, with some help from SCSO, substantially brought this about. We've already located some of the evicted residents in and around Gold Bar, and will work to prevent a recurrence of the impact this group had on our citizens.
- July 4th: I came in, as usual, to patrol for fireworks violations in and around Gold Bar. There were some, most of which were minor, and I did contact a group of people who had just finished setting off mortars in Creekside. I did not witness this violation so I was not able to satisfy the "police presence" requirement for issuing a ticket to the violators. I did issue warnings. There were also violations along May Creek but I wasn't able to determine the precise location of the offense before it stopped. The great majority of the mortar-type fireworks displays I investigated were determined to be just outside the city limits. One series of loud bangs may have come from the discharge of a firearm along May Creek but the violator was not located.
- Property crimes: Though theft related crimes appeared to be rising in June, this trend did not continue for the region through July.




• Theft from rental property: Roofing materials and three motorcycles, owned by the landlord, were stolen from a rental property on Index Ave as the tenants were moving out. A vehicle of interest has been described as a compact pick-up, possibly gray, pulling an enclosed cargo/toy-hauler type trailer. A group of area property and drug crime offenders had expressed some interest in this property when they learned the tenants were vacating. We continue to work this case.


