NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED by the governing body of the City of Gold Bar as follows:

Section I, Reporting

The City of Gold Bar shall produce a report regarding the City's energy usage and provide a seven-year cost-benefit analysis on switching city properties to 100% renewable energy sources. The report is due no later than the second meeting in April of 2020.

Section II, Funding

The city will actively look for grants and other funding sources, both private and public, to make the City of Gold Bar a more environmentally efficient city.

Section III, Severability

This resolution is severable and if any portion of it shall be declared invalid or unconstitutional, the remaining portion shall remain valid and enforceable.

Section IV, Effective Date

This Resolution shall take effect from, and after, its passage and approval, as provided by law.
